These are two of the most fire-prone areas in the home due to creosote and soot build up in the chimney and lint build up in the dryer vent. Most of all it provides peace of mind.

Quick Reminders

- Please remember that debris and unwanted items are not to be put by the street at any time. If you need someone to haul debris one suggestion is, Junk King (813 534 4349). Only household trash and garbage are to be placed in the dumpsters.
- Recycling items should be placed in green cans by community trash areas. Items that can be recycled through the City of Tampa include: Phone books, paperback books, junk mail, cardboard, magazines, newspapers, catalogs, plastic containers, food and beverage containers, aluminum and steel cans. Items that cannot be recycled include plastic bags and styrofoam.
- Dogs are not allowed in the courtyard or any common areas.
- Fire pits and fireworks are not allowed anywhere on the property.
